

Medications That Affect Allergy Skin Testing

Below are medications that **MUST** be stopped a minimum of 7-10 days prior to allergy testing

Allergy Medications:

Allegra	(Generic: Fexofenadine)	Claritin	(Generic: Loratadine)
Atarax	(Generic: Hydroxyzine)	Clarinex	(Generic: Desloratadine)
Benadryl	(Generic: Diphenhydramine)	Xyzal	(Generic: Levocetirizine)
Chlor-Trimeton	(Generic: Chlorpheniramine)	Zyrtec	(Generic: Cetirizine)
Astelin/Astepro	Nasal Sprays	Patanol/Pataday	Eye Drops

The following heart burn medications also **DO AFFECT** allergy testing:

Pepcid	(Generic: Famotidine)	Tagamet	(Generic: Cimetidine)
Zantac	(Generic: Ranitidine)	Tylenol PM	(And <u>all</u> other "PM" medications)
